# Vandals smash AP&I

A trail of destruction has been left around Levin by at least one group of teenagers, with the AP&I Showgrounds a particular target.

The showgrounds are a private facility run by volunteers who put thousands of hours into maintaining it and often spend their own money on materials. Long-time AP&I Show volunteer and Shannon farmer Gilbert Timms is outraged.

"It is an absolute disgrace. Now people like me, at 82, have to go in and repair all the damage to a facility that we have looked after for decades."

The show's sheep pens, used every Tuesday by Carrfields Livestock Auctions, had rails kicked in and gates ripped off their hinges only three months out from the 2026 show.

Show administrator Jill Timms says every gate was open, and every hinge ripped off or damaged enough that they could no longer be closed

"The police were here three times prior to the long weekend, and a lot more has happened since then."

Damage to a large section of iron-panel fencing during storms and the recent tornado meant the showgrounds were visible from Tiro Tiro Road, which allowed locals to report the vandalism while it was in progress.

Vandalism to the show's grandstand has graffiti all over it, and new iron installed at the back has been kicked, dented, and graffitied. At least two places in the grandstand show signs of attempted arson.

In the horse stalls, a pole was ripped out of the ground and dumped elsewhere. There is damage in the pig pens, most severely to the entry gate, which was kicked open with the locking mechanism still in place.

The showgrounds have had to deal with damage before, as they are open to the public year-round. They are used throughout the week by many community groups, and most weekends for large events such as the Christmas Fair, Age on the Go Show, and the huge AP&I Show at the end of January each year.

It is privately owned and mostly run by scores of volunteers like 82-year-old Gilbert.

"In more than 50 years as a volunteer with the show, I have never seen it this bad," he says.


His family is among many locals who have supported the annual AP&I Show ever since it started in 1907, when it was at the Levin race course. Like many other families, they have been involved for generations, offering their labour, materials, and expertise.

Gilbert is a steward for the show's sheep section – also often winning top prizes – and has been on the show's committee for 50 years.

"I've been involved since I was 17, and my dad was involved in moving the buildings from the race course to the showgrounds. My dad had the contract to paint the roofs. I was in primary school at the time. We have also raised a lot of money for the showgrounds over the years, and to see it treated with such disrespect is heartbreaking.

"I can't believe what they have done. What do they get out of it? There is nothing to steal and sell on," he says.

Levin police have already dealt with several alleged offenders.



## Elemental takes top cider award

Elemental Cider has been crowned New Zealand's Champion Producer at the 36th Annual NZ Fruit Wine & Cider Awards, held in Nelson on October 31.

The win cements Elemental's founder and cidermaker Carmen Gray – New Zealand's only female cidermaker – as one of the country's leading innovators in traditional craft cider.

The cidery claimed the top producer title after earning two best in class trophies, two golds, five silvers and a bronze, including trophies for its Pohutukawa Flower (cider with botanicals, spices & hops) and Dry As (bottle-fermented cider).

"Crafting cider is about patience, curiosity, and respect for the fruit," Carmen says. "To be recognised among the best in the country is incredibly humbling. This award reflects years of hard work."

Based between Ōhau and Ōtaki, Elemental grows its own specialty cider apples, pressing, fermenting and bottling every drop by hand. Judges praised the cidery's lineup for "balancing tradition, structure and fresh thinking," describing its delicate florals, refined dryness

and use of native botanicals as "a benchmark for contemporary cider craft".

The award caps a standout year for Elemental, known for its authenticity and innovation. Its Pohutukawa Flower cider, made from the red stamens of the native pōhutukawa, has now taken gold and best in class for three consecutive years.

Two new releases are continuing that creative momentum: Wild Ginger, infused with ginger root, native kawakawa and a hint of honey; and Apple Blossom, the first cider made from a new New Zealand-bred apple variety, Pure Blossom.

"Pohutukawa Flower has become our signature – Aotearoa's summer in a glass," Carmen says. "Wild Ginger and Apple Blossom build on that story. Each reflects place, patience, and the incredible diversity of New Zealandgrown fruit."

## Dogs put through paces at Showground

More than 500 dogs of all shapes and sizes will be on show in Levin tomorrow (Saturday) for the 91st running of the annual Hutt Valley Kennel Club competition show.

The club is using the Levin Showground as the venue for the show this year as their traditional venue in Porirua has been sold. HVKC secretary/treasurer Gary Carleton says the Levin Showground was recognised as an ideal interim venue until they found a new home.

Judges are coming from Sweden, Denmark and Australia to run their eye over an expected 100 breeds of dogs, looking for physical and behavioural traits that make one dog stand out from the rest.

Local dog breeder Frank Muncey, who plans to show four of his bulldogs tomorrow, wasn't complaining about the venue change.

"It's just down the road," he says.

Frank has been breeding dogs for more than 20 years. He says he loves his dogs and loves the breed: "It's always a buzz when you have bred a nice dog. Real dog people love their dogs and you're careful how you breed them and why you breed them."

Frank currently has 10 dogs at home and is selective about his breeding process in trying to eliminate any undesirable traits and hence is also selective who he sells puppies to.

The Best in Show dog wins \$500 cash. The event is free and gates open at 7am.

# **Equine therapy used to boost mental health**

It's Gumboot Friday today and a team using horses to improve youth mental health is celebrating it with their equine work colleagues.

Herd by Horses has used equineassisted psychotherapy to help youth navigate a diverse range of mental health challenges.

Horse specialist Kelly Boyens, registered counsellor Carolyn Brown and their team of horses have been operating for 11 years now.

Their horse courses cater for young people aged between 5 and 25, with school or private bookings, or referrals from the likes of police, Oranga Tamariki, Youth Justice, and Mana Whaikaha.

They currently have 225 registered clients and use a ground-based approach to gaining the trust of horses, using the animals as a metaphor to help clients grow and heal.

Many clients are neuro-diverse, and some are non-verbal. Kelly says horses help young people build confidence, emotional regulation, and trust.

Carolyn says clients project through the horses.

"They might look at the horse and are asked how they think the horse feels and what it is thinking,

and it starts to open up those conversations," she says.

"It helps with mindfulness, bringing them into the present and focusing on what they can hear, feel and see."

Having the horse perform a set task or negotiate an obstacle often requires co-operation and a calm and soothing approach to have the horse respond.

Kelly says clients each have their own name for their horse to form a connection, and they've come up with names like Chocolate, Pebbles – even Chicken Bone.

"It helps them form that relationship.

"A completely different side can come out," she says.

Kelly says the horse-based approach can have a positive effect on the whole family.

"We often get feedback that there has been a change in behaviour, or things are a lot calmer going back to class, for example," she says.

Herd By Horses says they have been successful in receiving Gumboot Friday funding in the past and were supportive of the annual appeal.

## Ōhau celebrates hall

Several hundred people celebrated Ōhau Hall's 125th anniversary last weekend.

On Saturday members of the hall committee, Muhunoa Rural Women and other gathered hundreds of delicate porcelain china plates, cups and saucers, for a high tea. Several people dressed up in 1900 attire, including Bob Pattison, who came as a hobo.

Built in 1900, Ōhau's hall went through two fires in the 1940s, with the one on May 31, 1942, destroying the building. It was rebuilt in 1944 thanks to community efforts.

"That in itself was an amazing feat achieved by the community in the middle of a war," said hall committee secretary Pauline May.

## Loud bangs, quiet paws - tips on how to keep pets calm

Before November rolls around, I always start preparing for one of the most challenging times of year for our pets – Guy Fawkes.

While the bright colours and booming sounds of fireworks delight many of us, it's often a night filled with fear, trembling, and confusion for our furry companions.

I've seen firsthand how distressing fireworks can be for dogs and cats. About 40-50% of pets suffer from some degree of noise-related anxiety. Sadly, this fear rarely fades over time – it often gets worse each year if left unaddressed. That's why I encourage every pet owner to plan well before the fireworks start.



Fear doesn't always look the same in every animal. Some pets might pant, pace, hide, tremble, or cling to you, while others refuse food or try desperately to escape. I've even seen dogs injure themselves trying to claw through doors or fences. Cats might hide for hours or toilet inside because they're too afraid to move.

These behaviours aren't "bad"

– they're signs of panic. It's
heartbreaking to see, and it can also

be incredibly stressful for owners. But there's a lot we can do to make the experience easier.

A week or two before the big night, I recommend setting up a secure, quiet "den" where your pet can retreat. This could be a covered crate, a small laundry room, or even a wardrobe – wherever your pet naturally hides when scared. Add bedding, close windows, draw curtains, and make sure the cat door is locked.

To help muffle the noise, use background sounds – a TV, radio, or even pet-calming music. Continuous noise helps mask those sudden booms that make pets jump. Some animals do better with soothing

tunes; others cope better when the soundscape is slightly busier.

Take your dog for a long walk and toilet break before dusk. During the fireworks, distraction is a powerful ally – offer a favourite chew, a stuffed Kong, or a LickiMat to keep them engaged.

If you're home, your calm presence will make a world of difference. Pets take their cues from us, so try to stay relaxed. And please, never punish fear-based behaviours like whining, trembling, or toileting indoors. These are signs of distress, not disobedience, and punishment will only make the

Before Guy Fawkes, doublecheck that your pet's microchip and registration details are up to date. Even the most secure pets can bolt in panic, and accurate ID is often the only way they make it home safely.

For pets with severe anxiety, talk to your vet as soon as possible. There are safe, effective medications and behaviour plans that can make a huge difference, but they need to be discussed before the fireworks begin.

Every year, I see how deeply noise anxiety affects both pets and their people. With a bit of preparation, though, we can turn a frightening night into a manageable one.

Wishing you – and your pets – a safe, peaceful Guy Fawkes night.

## Roimata takes top Pounamu award

It was a popular hometown victory at the annual Pounamu Country Music Awards last weekend with talented Levin performer Roimata Neilsen winning the overall supreme award.

Roimata, 39, wowed the big crowd and the judges in a popular victory, winning automatic entry for the prestigious NZ Entertainer of the Year Awards in Rotorua next year.

Despite having a rich country music heritage, it's just the third time Roimata had competed on stage at the awards. She had won the first time she sang at the awards in 2018, and again when she entered in 2020, so the record speaks for itself. She is a special talent.

Roimata says competing wasn't the most important thing for her about performing.

"It's not really my thing. I like to do it because I enjoy it," she says. "I enjoy the music and the company and catching up with my people."

Roimata's late mother, Doris Neilsen, was a huge fan of country music and a founding member of Foxton's Delta Country Music Club.

As a youngster Roimata and her brothers and sisters would follow their mother and watch her and others sing and perform, and were encouraged to join in themselves at every turn.

Roimata's father, Greg, likes to joke that he taught his daughter everything she knows, but

concedes she inherited her love of music from her mother.

"Dad is tone deaf," she says.

Roimata, a school teacher at Freybreg High School in Palmerston North, shone out against a big field at the Levin Cosmopolitan Club at the weekend, with performers coming from as far away as Auckland, Gisborne and Nelson.

Roimata competed in four sections in the Pounamu Awards. As she made it to the final in each section, she had to sing a total of eight different songs.

In the Country Rock sections she sang Redneck Woman and Blue Moon of Kentucky; in the Female Solo section When He Leaves You and Sweet Memories; Country Gospel The Master's Calling and This Is My Desire; and Western Tumbling Tumbleweed and Cattle Call.

Roimata says she loves everything about the country music scene in New Zealand.

"Everyone is there to listen, have a good time and encourage everyone else. It's like a community."

## Kids help build Ō2NL lizard habitat

Schoolchildren are helping to create a habitat to protect lizards while the O2NL expressway is being built. Led by O2NL project iwi partners and Enviroschools Horowhenua, last week pupils from six schools worked in groups to build lizard homes using natural materials like sticks, logs, rocks and branches. While the fence on the specially designed 4-hectare predatorproof area was completed in August, it had had to remain pest-free for at least 30 days before lizards could move in. The enclosure is tailored to suit different species, including the ornate skink, brown skink, copper skink, and northern grass skink. Any lizards found during vegetation clearance must be safely relocated to a secure, predator-free area. Early site investigations confirmed the presence of several protected species within the project footprint. The area will serve as a long-term sanctuary for the protected species, both during and after construction.

## **MAHI MĀRA/Gardening**



Let's start by complaining what a poor spring we have had so far, with storms, winds, and rains that put a dampener on many days – and Labour Weekend just gone, the traditional time to plant tender plants like tomatoes and cucumbers.

I remember one wise gardening writer, Nick Scott, used to say it was better to leave the tender ones for a month after Labour Weekend.

He was not far wrong. If the temperatures are not warm enough and the soil is cold, those plants will



just sit and sulk till conditions improve.

One consolation is that insect pests that started earlier will have been knocked back

so the problems they cause will be less for a while. But you must stay vigilant and at any early signs of insect pests you should spray late in the day, when sun is off the garden, with Super Neem Tree Oil and Super Pyrethrum added together in the same sprayer.

The Super Pyrethrum is so concentrated that you only use 1ml per litre of spray (thats like a drop

into a litre) but at the dilution rate it has tremendous knock-down power, lasting through the night till the sun comes up next day. Then within about two hours it's gone.

Recently we have been selling many packs of 1kg boric acid, suddenly out of the blue. Whenever a sudden demand for a not usual product happens there's always a reason – more often it's because several people have seen something on the internet that has caused them to buy.

I phoned one customer and I was told about an effective method of controlling wasps.

You make up the attractant/bait with a litre of orange juice, add 2 tablespoons of boric acid, and stir to dissolve the powder. Then take an empty soft-drink can and pour in the solution to about one-third full.

Put a straw or stick into the can through the open tab down into the liquid. Place the can outside where there is known wasp activity. The wasps will smell the orange juice and climb down the stick into the can to take up the sweet solution before flying back to the nest to feed it to the hive. Boric acid is a poison and that's what kills the wasps.

I'm told that honey bees and bumble bees are not attracted to the solution.

Boric acid is used in medicine, pest control, and household products, but its safety depends on the application and amount used. It should be used with care, as ingesting or inhaling large amounts can be harmful.

It's used topically to treat certain infections, like yeast infections and athlete's foot, and as an antiseptic eyewash. It can be used as an antifungal ointment or powder and removes any foot odour by applying it inside socks. It is also useful for treating vaginal infections.

Boric acid also acts as an insecticide to control ants, cockroaches, termites and flies, and even mice and rats.

It can be used in cleaning products, personal care items, and as a flame retardant.

For cockroaches simply sprinkle

the powder behind the stove or fridge where the cockroaches will walk through. When they clean the powder off their feet they die.

For ants mix 50:50 with icing sugar and place as dry bait by ant trails or at the entrance of their nest.

Another tip that took my fancy was from a picture of Chinese gardeners placing round, smooth river rocks about 10cm in diameter on top of watermelons coming to maturity. The rocks gather heat during the day and keep the watermelon warm for a while at night, likely speeding up the ripening process.

A reader sent me a clip of Indian farmers obtaining a potent, natural plant food or foliage food spray.

The recipe is 20kg of cow or other manure, 20l of cow urine, 2kg of molasses and 2kg of wheat flour. Stir and ferment for about five days. Then dilute 1:200 with water to spray over the foliage of crops/plants.

I always feel welcome at these and wonder if I'd feel so much a part of the community if I was a big-city mayor.

It's also heartwarming to congratulate the many local businesses who won prizes at the Electra Business and Innovation awards, and to acknowledge the decades of service of Geoff Kane, local farmer and community leader, whom we've inducted into the Horowhenua Hall of Fame.

It all goes to show yet again what a lovely community we all live in. It's a timely reminder that serving that community isn't just a responsibility – it's a joy. And joy was what I saw on the faces of our elected members, new and returning, at that inauguration ceremony.

#### In the Works

Work on replacing the main inlet pipe at the Levin wastewater treatment plant on Mako Mako Road is going at pace. We're about to start on the second stage, from the corner of Adkin Avenue and Collingwood Street through to Tiro Tiro Road north of Trafalgar Street.

We're also upgrading the headworks, which is the first stage of treatment when the pipe enters the plant. The work is urgently needed as the plant is now more than 70 years old, is deteriorating, and needs repairs and upgrades to ensure it meets current needs and is able to accommodate future growth in the region.

We're in the final stages of replacing water and wastewater mains on MacArthur Street in Levin. The work has been going since January and has now reached the Fairfield Road end of the street. We're on track to finish in December.

Unfortunately some disruption is inevitable while this important work takes place. Please take notice and follow the temporary traffic management as it might change from day to day, and thank you as always for your patience.

We've installed a beautiful new mobile recycling centre outside the Shannon waste transfer station on Thompson Street. It's big, clean and easy to use, and it has steps on one side for people who have trouble reaching the recycling slots. 



## The great fire that ravaged Levin in 1898

On Wednesday February 9, 1898, at 2am a Mr Smithson gave the alarm for a growing fire in the heart of Levin.

The town had not yet acquired a fire bell, so Miss Bowen, the postmistress, got the key to the English church, and with the assistance of a Mr Nation Jn, rang the church bell to warn people. This ended in its own mini disaster with the bell falling down after a few rings. However, many people were roused, and by all accounts, worked hard to save goods and property.

The Levin Hotel stood on the corner of Queen and Oxford streets. South of the hotel was, it is believed, a gap to the privately owned Town Hall. This had a shop and office in the front onto Oxford Street, run by chemist Ernest Levy. Next was the Horowhenua County Council's office in the same building as Mr Barnard's jewellery shop.

Next was Mr James the shoemaker, Frank Keen, a hairdresser and tobacconist with a billiard saloon. He had just sold his business and

was in Wellington to collect payment at the time of the fire.

Then was Frederick Pink, also a bootmaker. His shop was owned by the future borough mayor, Basil Gardner. Next was David Smart's bookshop, which might also have housed the office of solicitor H Fitzherbert.

The fire appeared to have started in the Town Hall and spread to all the above shops, all built of wood with no separation between them. People helped to get stock out of some the shops. It was reported as: ". . . all along the street a clearance of goods from shops was made just in time, the flames devouring the buildings in rapid succession".

Marco Fosella's general store was next in line to the south, but it was saved by a change in the wind. The Levin Hotel was also saved by the wind change. The wind must have changed to a west-east direction as it was also reported that the Te Aro House branch building (Clarke's) was nearly destroyed. This building is on the opposite side of Oxford Street, so it must have been a strong wind.

The hotel was also saved by the action of several men. It was reported that Walter Gardener stood on the fire-escape landing, and with the help of Messrs Laing, Seales, Leeson, Nordstrom, and Ellis,

used buckets of water on the hotel.

Basil Gardener found one of the hotel rooms on fire and "... with great exertion suppressed the flames and then fell exhausted".

Lost in the Town Hall was furniture, including a piano, dozens of skates and lots of books. The Foresters, Knights of Labour and Druids lost much of their material, and the Levin band lost quite a few instruments.

No-one knows how the fire started. There had been a dance in the hall the evening before, but that finished at 11pm and nothing seemed amiss by the organisers.

Fortunately all the County Council's valuable papers were in a safe, although they were found to be charred. It turned out the safe wasn't as safe as first thought.

Interestingly, the newspapers – as they did in those days – recorded the insurance cover of each place, including the name of the insurer and the amount of cover. No privacy as it would be today.

It must have been a scary fire. It would have been brave to go into likely burning buildings to rescue papers and stock. However, in the light of day, and even today it could be thought of as foolhardy.




